

## FYE/ACCESS Supplemental Instruction (SI) Program

### Overview

- SI generally targets traditionally high risk courses where there are high failure rates.
- SI is designed to improve students' grades in targeted courses.
- SI leaders work directly with professors of targeted courses.
- SI leaders facilitate review sessions that are parallel with the professor's classroom lessons.
- SI sessions can be conducted face-to-face or via Blackboard.
- The SI program is one of the few post-secondary programs to be designated as an "exemplary educational program" by the U. S. Department of Education.

### SI Leaders are NSU students who:

- Have a GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- Have successfully completed the course and/or is recommended by an instructor who teaches the course.
- Have been certified by the College Reading and Learning Association (this process takes place after the SI leader is hired).

### SI Results

- NSU faculty and staff who utilize SI services have been pleased with the services provided by the program.
- Students who regularly attend SI sessions tend to have higher assessment scores and pass the class.

### SI Process:

- Notify Robin Marable concerning your interest in the SI program.
- An SI leader will be identified for your course.
- SI leaders will share review sessions' times and places with course faculty/staff members and with students enrolled in the class.
- SI leaders will track students who attend SI sessions.
- SI leaders will share all student progress with the course faculty/staff.
